5. How many moose ticks have been found on one individual moose?
6. What animal is known as the brush wolf? Is it truly a wolf?
7. What are some reasons that wolves would howl? Describe a situation in which they would choose not to howl.
8. What other stories exist that demonstrate inaccurate information or stereotypes about animals, places or people?
9. Has a healthy wild wolf ever killed a human in North America?
